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Вступ

Методичний посібник призначений для роботи студентів 2 курсу факультету іноземних мов спеціальності 035 Філологія. 035.04 Германські мови і літератури (переклад включно) з навчальної дисципліни «Друга іноземна мова» (англійська) для аспектів «Лексика» і «Граматика» (Модуль 1) та відповідає затвердженій навчальній програмі із вказаної дисципліни.

Посібник розроблений з метою здійснення контролю знань у студентів, містить низку лексико-граматичних тестів, які відповідають лексико-граматичним темам першого модуля 3-го семестру навчання. Водночас посібник може використовуватися студентами у самостійній роботі для формування та закріплення одиниць лексико-граматичної компетенції.

Збірка тестів складається з двох розділів «Лексика» та «Граматика», кожен з яких містить по 5 частин. У розділі «Лексика» представлені тести на перевірку лексичного матеріалу з таких тем як: Eating places, Surroundings, Meals, Menu, Ways of cutting, Ways of cooking, Fish. Vegetables.
